

# Healthy food from home

■ A nationwide bus tour  
will be stopping in Victor.

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VICTOR — If you love locally produced goods, Victor is the place to be this afternoon.

Members of Sustainable Table, a New York-based nonprofit group, will be rolling into town on their “Eat Well Guided Tour of America.”

They’re in eastern Idaho to see the harvested crops that several children in the area have been producing during the summer.

“In my opinion, it’s one of our best stops along the way,” media spokeswoman Denise Hughes said.

The children are part of a summer program imparting the importance of healthy food. They’ve spent several months planting, weeding and harvesting their own crops.

“It’s been hard work to grow the crops, but I know it will be worth it in the end,” said Chris Watters, 10.

Watters and other participants will be serving dinner at 5:30 p.m. — the menu made from local ingredients.

“We hope to show what impact this has had on the kids’ life,” dinner organizer Sue Muncaster said.

The goal of the tour, she said, is to show Americans there’s more than fast food.

Diane Hatz, founder of Sustainable Table, decided the road tour would be a perfect way to accomplish that goal. She believes it’s important for communities to support their local farmers.

Hatz knew a stop in Victor would be the perfect addition to her 38-day tour that stretches from coast to coast.

“We got word that there’s great things happening (in Victor) and decided to stop and check it out,” she said.
